Caitlin Doyle is a poet, essayist, critic, and librettist whose work has appeared in *The Guardian*, *The Atlantic*, *Yale Review*, *The Los Angeles Review of Books*, *Best New Poets*, *American Life in Poetry*, the PBS *NewsHour* Online Poetry Series, and elsewhere. She has received awards, scholarships, and fellowships through the Yaddo Colony, the MacDowell Colony, the James Merrill House Writer-In-Residence Program, the Sewanee Writers' Conference, the Bread Loaf Writers' Conference, and the Association of Literary Scholars, Critics, and Writers, among others. The recipient of a Pushcart Prize Special Mention, she has taught writing and literature as the Writer-In-Residence at Interlochen Arts Academy, the Emerging Writer-In-Residence at Penn State Altoona, a Lecturer in Creative Writing at Boston University, an Elliston Fellow in Poetry at the University of Cincinnati, and the Writer-In-Residence at St. Albans School. Most recently, Caitlin has taught as Visiting Assistant Professor of English and Writer-In-Residence at Washington & Jefferson College. She earned a PhD from the University of Cincinnati, where she was the Associate Editor of *The Cincinnati Review*. Caitlin is a faculty member at the Frost Farm Poetry Conference, and she serves as Interviews Editor for *Literary Matters*. She is working toward the completion of her debut poetry collection.
